GET CARDED THIS SEPTEMBER WITH CHARLOTTE MECKLENBURG LIBRARY

Sign-up online for a FREE Library card today

Charlotte, NC – September 1, 2020 – This September, Charlotte Mecklenburg Library joins the American Library Association and libraries nationwide to celebrate Library Card Sign-Up Month. A Library card opens a door to unlimited possibilities in a world rapidly moving to an online format where access to digital resources and educational materials is more important than ever before. Throughout the month, the Library encourages those in the community who don't already have a Library card to sign up for one through a campaign that showcases Wonder Woman in promotional materials proclaiming, "Libraries are Wonderful." With a Library card, one can gain access to books, media and invaluable digital resources. The Library card is FREE for Mecklenburg residents (\$45 per year for non-residents) and it's easy to sign up at cmlibrary.org/getacard.

Many residents aren't aware of the extensive digital and online resources the Library offers for free. These include e-books, audiobooks, streaming movies and videos, and access to hundreds of online journals, newspapers and databases in addition to programs and services. The Robinson-Spangler Carolina Room also provides access to Ancestry.com – a membership savings of \$20 each month. "The Library is the place where anyone can access books and other materials, resources, information and services that help them learn and grow as individuals as well as contribute to a stronger community," says Caitlin Moen, library director and chief customer officer for Charlotte Mecklenburg Library. Of course, there are plenty of recreational options as well, including books, music, magazines and movies. With all this available for free, this is why we want every Mecklenburg County resident to have a library card."

The Library offers a variety of digital resources and virtual programs for all ages ranging from children to adults. Programs and resources include virtual tutoring and homework help, family storytimes, STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics) programs, and professional development programs like job help, resume writing and interview preparation.


