Sign-up online for a FREE Library card today

Charlotte, NC – August 30, 2021 – This September, Charlotte Mecklenburg Library joins the American Library Association (ALA) and libraries nationwide to celebrate Library Card Sign-Up Month. A Library card opens a door to unlimited possibilities in a world rapidly moving online where access to digital resources and educational materials is more important than ever. Throughout the month, the Library encourages those in the community without Library cards to sign up for one through a campaign that highlights the importance and value of having a library card. This year, the ALA installed Marley Dias, author, executive producer and founder of <u>#1000BlackGirlBooks</u> as Library Card Sign-up Month Honorary Chair to promote the value of a library card to the entire community. Informative resources featuring Marley Dias were provided by the ALA for the Library to use. With a Library card, one gains access to books, media and invaluable digital resources. Library cards are FREE for Mecklenburg residents (\$45 per year for non-residents) and are easy to obtain at <u>cmlibrary.org/getacard</u>.

Many residents aren't aware of the extensive digital and online resources the Library offers for free including e-books, audiobooks and e-audiobooks, streaming movies and videos, and access to hundreds of online journals, newspapers and databases, in addition to programs and services. The Robinson-Spangler Carolina Room also provides access to Ancestry.com – a membership savings of \$20 each month.
